

Evans wins Pro-Tour - McGhee to CSC – O’Grady back - Rogers scrutinized

Cadel Evans(Predictor-Lotto) is the 2007 Pro-Tour Champion after finishing 6th in the Tour of Lombardy. Although he inherited the lead in the competition when **Danilo Di Luca**(Liquigas) was suspended, he finished with more points than Di Luca and still has a bonus coming from the Tour de France when he finally gets the stage win in the time trial where first placed Alexandre Vinokourov subsequently tested positive. **Bradley McGhee**, whose recent years at FDJ have been plagued by injury has left the only pro team he has ridden for and joined CSC. **Stuart O’Grady**(CSC) has recovered from his horror crash in the Tour de France and completed the Herald-Sun Tour which was won by **Matt Wilson**(Unibet) by just 3 seconds from **Steve Morabito**(Astana). **Michael Rogers**(T-Mobile) has found himself embroiled in accusations of drug use in the 2006 T-Mobile Tour team by sacked rider **Patrick Sinkewitz**. He is the only member of the current T-Mobile team left from the 2006 Tour team. Bendigo’s **Tim Dekker**(Decked Out Coaching) won the 299 km Melbourne-Warrnambool, the world’s longest race, from **Ben King** (Cycle Mania) and **Mark Hooper**(Baum). The launch of the 2008 Tour de France tactfully omitted this year’s mountaintop duels between **Alberto Contador**(Discovery Channel) and **Michael**
